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According to "Economist Intelligence Unit's (EIU)" of "The Economist" magazine, the overall quality of life on the planet has decreased by 1%, as a result of both the economic crisis and international conflicts, even so, fortunately, it is estimated that the quality of life will rise again in the coming years.
